Policy on Scattering of Ashes

Purpose:

This policy sets out the conditions under which ashes may be scattered on the golf course, ensuring requests are handled respectfully while preserving the integrity and upkeep of the course.

1. General Principles

- The Club recognises that members and their families may wish to have ashes scattered on the course due to personal or historical connections with the Club.
- All requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis, and approval is at the discretion of the Club's Management Committee.

2. Application Procedure

- A formal request must be submitted in writing to the Club Secretary or General Manager, including:
 - Name of the deceased.
 - Relationship to the Club.
 - Preferred date and time.
 - Preferred location on the course.

3. Conditions

- Scattering of ashes must be done discreetly and respectfully.
- A club official may be present to oversee the scattering.
- Ashes must be scattered, not buried, and no memorials, plaques, flowers, or markers may be left on the course without prior approval.
- The scattering must not interfere with play or maintenance.
- Preferred areas for scattering may be designated by the Club (e.g. near specific trees, behind certain tees, or out-of-play areas).

4. Timing

- Scattering must take place outside of peak playing hours, ideally early morning or late evening.
- Weekends and competition days may be excluded unless special arrangements are approved.

5. Record Keeping

- The Club will keep a confidential log of all ash-scattering events for internal records.

6. Discretionary Rights

- The Club reserves the right to deny requests if it is deemed inappropriate or detrimental to the course or its members.
- This policy may be reviewed and amended by the Club Committee at any time.
